Disability Awareness Month

The North West Department of Education has deemed it necessary to join the country in celebrating the Disability Month that is being celebrated every year from the 03rd of November - 03rd of December.

The Disability Month celebration is meant to represent the disabled persons who are disregarded and sidelined by the communities around South Africa. It was mainly planned to demystify the misconception that the disabled learners cannot do anything for themselves and for the communities at large. 7 schools from Dr Kenneth Kanda Districts, namely: Ikalafeng Special School, Die Wilge High School, Keurhof, Daeraad, North West Secondary school for the Deaf, Janie Schneider, ES le Grange were invited to participate in the activity that took place from 24 to 25 November 2023.

The main purpose was to ensure that advocacy and skills offered by special schools are well recognized by community and stakeholders. It was also to make an awareness of the importance of learners with disabilities and the critical role that they play in schools. Among the 7 schools, Keurhof specializes in producing steel products, like Braai Stand Pots and Die Wilge High School in Arts Crafts, Baking, etc. Bongani Zungu from Keurhof Special School showcased his talent by performing a song that will enable him to represent South Africa at New York from 23 June to 1 July 2024.

This showcase took place at Matlosana Mall, in Klerksdorp Dr Kenneth Kaunda District. The event was successfully graced by the presence of acting director of Learner Social Support Services Ms Lucy Tong, acting CES Ms Gertrude Mtotoba, Mr Baebae Masoa CES From the office of the district Director, Principal and Learners from the district and departmental officials from District and corporate.







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Early Grade Reading Programme Handing Over In Dr Ruth S. Mompati District By Kelebogile Mothibi

Reading is very key in foundation of a child, most importantly it helps learners to have better cognitive skills and encourage them to learn, write and read.

It also lays the strong foundation for children's education and helps them to perform better. Without reading and comprehensive skills, children will struggle to grow academically.

The Programme included training of Foundation Phase educators who teach Setswana Home Language and English First Additional Language. It also helps with strengthening educators to enhance learning in the classroom.

The aim of the programme is to improve leaner's reading capability in the foundation phase.

In 2021 the North West Education, UNICEF, Molteno rolled out the EGRP (Early Grade Reading Programme) in Grade 1 to 3 schools across Dr Ruth S. Mompati District and ended in November 2023. When it started only 40 schools were piloted in the District

Prior to the official handing over of the project, the District hosted reading and spelling BEE competition across the District and the District level was held at Mamusa Library on the 16th November 2023 under the theme "readers are leaders" The aim of the event was to sustain the culture of reading and with more emphasises on reading with understanding for the love of reading. Furthermore, to build a better tomorrow and society for our future leaders.

Department of Basic Education, Molteno, UNICEF, Provincial Teacher Development and District inclusive of District Director, GET Coordinators, Special Project and Programmes Coordinator held a consultative meeting on the 22 November 2023 prior the official handing over. The aim was giving feedback of the project in the District.

The hand over was held on the 23 November 2023 at Vryburg Primary School where Ms Moalusi DCES, Special Projects and Programmes gave updates on context: key developments in the District, reflection on the EGRP implementation and updates on reading competitions. She also appreciated the educators and principals for their undivided support. Teacher Development Sub Directorate was applauded for affording the District with the exceptional programme.



Positive remarks and findings of the project in the District were shared by DBE, MOLTENO and UNICEF SACO were shared respectively. Dr Mohohlwane (DBE) also elaborated on the roles of principals and other stakeholders in the process of sustaining EGRP in schools. She further indicated the importance of scaling interventions for sustainability.

During the feedback session, educators volunteered to share their experience with EGRP, regarding how they have been preparing their lesson plans prior to the implementation, the beginning stages and the completion phases. The educators are now showing passion and enjoying teaching and learning in the classroom. In conclusion, Mr K. Modise encouraged educators to sustain the EGRP in the District as it's really value for money.







Ngaka Modiri Molema District World Robotic Olympiad (WRO) Local Competition

The UJ-TechnoLab and Standard Bank Robotics project is an initiative by UJ-TechnoLab under the faculty of engineering and Built Environment. The initiative started in 2020 but covid 19 hit and the actual implementation started in 2021 with Limpopo and the North West Province. In the North West province, the participating districts are Ngaka Modiri Molema and Bojanala.

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The main objective for the project was to introduce coding and robotics to primary schools. The model for introducing the project included workshops for the educators of identified schools, establishment of robotics clubs and supporting the educators during the robotics club practices. Each school received a tablet, laptop and robot for the educator.

The learners participated in the robotic Olympiad in-house then proceeded to the world robotic Olympiad(WRO). On the 10th November 2023 the winning teams from the WRO from the respective schools participated in the District competitions wish were held at Mafikeng Primary School, whereby learners showcased their robotic skills.







In 2023 the teams learned about shipping logistics and the infrastructure for digital technology. The learners had to investigate how robots can help both shipping and digital technology infrastructure to be more safe, sustainable and efficient.

All the learners who participated in the project received WRO Certificates and gifts from UJ-TechnoLab.

PROFESSIONAL EDUCATOR DEVELOPMENT SERVICES STRATEGIC PLANNING

The Directorate of Professional Educator Development Services in the Department of Education, led by Ms Masego Senna held its 3 days Provincial Strategic Lekgotla themed" strengthening implementation beyond compliance towards performance culture". The Lekgotla was at Orion Safari Hotel from 29th November to 1st December 2023. Professional Educator Development Services is informed by QMS EMS PMDS and Teacher Development.

The aim of PEDS Lekgotla was to develop well consulted 2024-2025 Provincial Teacher Development plan that should inform the work skills plan of the Department.

The objective of the strategic planning was to enhance teacher capacity to respond to key sectoral priorities for quality education. Proper implementation of Teacher Development policies and procedures in responding to key sectoral priorities. It was also to discuss employee assessment processes (QMS EMS PMDS) to improve implementation and credible reporting, to determining effective ways to address capacity building of employees and meet required deadlines. Lastly, to strengthening the functionality of districts teacher Development centres to make them key hubs for quality education

Ms Senna outlined the outputs of the past and current financial year as the five-year plan period comes to an end soon. It is also to properly implement teacher development policies and procedures, discuss employee assessment processes, lastly strengthen the functionality of District Teacher Development Centres.

Director of Teacher Development in Department of Basic Education, Mr Phillip Dikgomo, reminded officials (circuit coordinators, DTDC managers, Quality Management System, and Education Management Services, Performance Management Development System coordinators) that in order for this strategic to be successful, the policies should be in place.

He also spoke on the deliberate transition of Professional Learning from Professional Development. Furthermore, he alluded that foundation phase numeracy and reading, senior phase Mathematics, Natural Sciences and Economic Management Science are most needed to be looked into.

Ms Sibiya and Ms Matebana from DBE, Mr Malibe from SACE were also in attendance and presented on what the Department should focus on. Mr Goemeone Moseki, Deputy Director of Change Management encouraged teamwork and officials to embrace change.

Three commissions were formed and the way forward was as follows:

Incorporate APP & MTSF priorities 2024 and key programme focus for 2024(DBE) in PED Plan for 2024. Training of all officials on CA 3 of 2017 and verify alignment will take place around February 2024.PEDS and district will Immediate mediation of BDE/SACE policy mandates recommendations. 15 February will be induction of the newly appointed officials, system and processes. PTT (Corporate and Districts Coordinators) will have refresher training for Circuit Managers on QMS-Work plans.

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In line with the 40 pockets of excellence approach of the Early Childhood Development Directorate, a total number of 40 youth were recruited from all corners of the province to attend gardening training in Kgora Training Centre, at Ramatlabama, Mahikeng. The training is provided by the Department of Agriculture, Rural Development and Land Reform, through Agricultural Research Council(ARC).

The identified youth represented all municipalities in the province and would benefit at least two crèches from each local municipality beyond training. A week long training was scheduled to take place from the 05th till the 08th of December 2023, according to the department of education plan.

Mr Israel Motsamai on behalf of ECD, informed the new employees that they should take the gardeners training serious because that is the beginning of farming in their lifetimes. He assured the trainees that they will receive a stipend when providing services at the respective ECD centres/crèches and will also receive certificates upon completion of the training by ARC. The department has arranged similar/more training to be offered to other ECD participants on different fields including administration and storytellers to provide the necessary skills to the future leaders of the country.

In giving her word of encouragement to the participants, MEC Viola Motsumi reminded the youth that these important training will benefit them even beyond the piloted programme at the centres. She explained that "The training will give you an opportunity to gain knowledge and skills on all aspects of farming particularly on the field of plantation. I am pleading with you to take the training seriously and continue to do the work diligently and avoid any possibility of posing any threat to the young children at our ECD centres".

MEC Motsumi further encouraged the youth to go back to school and upgrade their current educational standards. She informed the audience that her dream is to see each and every village having its own Abet Centre that will assists the youth in the villages to access more education in future.
