**QUESTION 1: HOW DID AFRICAN NATIONALISM CHANGE IN SOUTH AFRICA IN THE PERIOD 1912 - 1948?**

- 1.1.3 How, according to the source, did African nationalism transform the identity of Africans? (1 x 1) (1)
- 1.1.4 Using the information in the source and your own knowledge explain why you think World War I spurred (encouraged) the rise of nationalism. (1 x 2) (2)
- 1.1.5 In what way did African nationalism differ from Afrikaner nationalism. (1 x 2) (2)
- 1.1.6 Name the political organisation that aimed to unite all indigenous people of South Africa. (1 x 1) (1)

- 1.2.1 What, according to the source, were the THREE reasons for the formation of the South African Native National Congress (SANNC)? (3 x 1) (3)
- 1.2.2 According to the source, what was the cause of the South African War (1899 to 1902)? (1 x 2) (2)
- 1.2.3 Explain why you think Africans opposed the formation of the Union of South Africa? (2 x 2) (4)
- 1.2.4 Using the information in the source and your own knowledge, comment on how African nationalists expressed their opposition to the formation of the Union of South Africa. (1 x 2) (2)
- 1.2.5 Identify TWO leaders of the SANNC in the source. (2 x 1) (2)

- 1.3.1 Why do you think this poster was advertised in 1921? (1 x 2) (2)

- 1.3.2 Comment on the usefulness of this poster to a historian studying African nationalism. (2 x 2) (4)
