INSTRUCTIONS TO TEACHERS

1. Learners are required to answer ALL the questions.
2. This marking guideline serves as a guide to markers. Some responses may require a marker's discretion.
3. Accept dialectal variations.
4. For multiple choice questions, accept BOTH the letter corresponding with the correct answer AND/OR the answer written out in full.
5. Learners' responses should be assessed as objectively as possible.

Marking the Comprehension

- Because the focus is on understanding, incorrect spelling and language errors in responses should not be penalised unless such errors change the meaning/understanding. (Errors must still be indicated.)
- If a learner uses words from a language other than the one being examined, disregard those words, and if the answer still makes sense, do not penalise. However, if a word from another language is used in a text and required in an answer, this is acceptable.
- For **open-ended questions**, no marks should be awarded for YES/NO or I AGREE/I DISAGREE or FACT/OPINION. The reason/substantiation/motivation is what should be considered.
- When one-word answers are required and the learner gives a whole sentence, mark correct provided that the correct word is underlined/highlighted.
- When two/three facts/points are required and a range is given, mark only the first two/three.

The following points form the answer to the question:

QUOTATION	FACTS
'Know whether your neighbours work during the day, whether they have children, and what their needs are.'	1. Know your neighbours./Know who your neighbour is.
'Have a way to reach your neighbours if they are gone and something is amiss in the neighbourhood.'	2. Know how to contact your neighbours if they are away from their home in case something goes wrong.
'A well-kept neighbourhood also provides fewer places for suspicious persons to take cover.'	3. Keep the neighbourhood well-kept to eliminate dark places to hide.
'Leaving your blinds open and lights on at night provides a free look into your house.'	4. Do not leave your blinds open and lights on at night.
'Leaving windows open at night is an invitation for an uninvited guest to come in.'	5. Do not leave windows open at night.
'Ask that each household turns on their porch lights in the evenings and install motion-sensor lights at the backs or sides of the house so that potential intruders do not have darkness to hide in.'	6. Turn on lights/motion-sensor lights at night.

Marking the summary

The summary should be marked as follows:

- **Mark allocation:**

- 7 marks for 7 points (1 mark per main point)
- 3 marks for language
- Total marks: 10

- **Distribution of language marks when candidate has not quoted verbatim:**

- 1–3 points correct: award 1 mark
- 4–5 points correct: award 2 marks
- 6–7 points correct: award 3 marks

- **Distribution of language marks when candidate has quoted verbatim:**

- 6–7 quotes: award no language mark
- 1–5 quotes: award 1 language mark

NOTE:

- **Format:**

Even if the summary is presented in the incorrect format, it must be assessed.

- **Word count:**

- Markers are required to verify the number of words used.
- Do not deduct any marks if the candidate fails to indicate the number of words used or if the number of words used is indicated incorrectly.
- If the word limit is exceeded, read up to the end of the sentence above the stipulated upper limit and ignore the rest of the summary.
